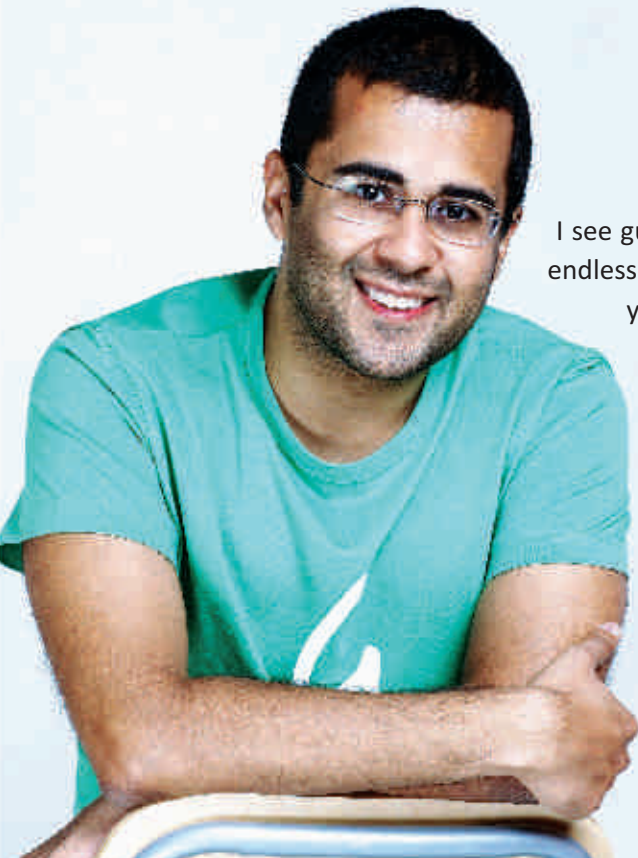

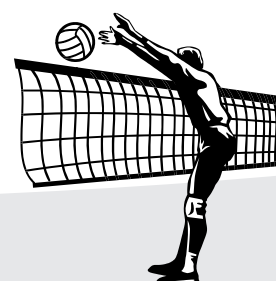

आखिर क्या है वास्तविक रूप शिक्षा का ?

जब भी मेरे मन में शिक्षा का विचार आता है तो, मेरे मन में यही प्रश्न उमड़ आता है, आखिर क्या है वास्तविक रूप शिक्षा का? क्या शिक्षा का महत्व सिर्फ परीक्षा में उत्तीर्ण होने व नौकरी पाने तक ही सीमित है? क्या यही शिक्षा का वजूद है? आज के मनुष्य मस्तिष्कों की सोच ने शिक्षा की आध्यात्मिक पवित्रता को नष्ट कर दिया है। लोग शिक्षा को सिर्फ एक औपचारिकता समझ कर पूरा कर रहे हैं। आज कल के विद्यार्थियों के लिए विद्यालय जाना सिर्फ एक मनोरंजन का उद्देश्य बन गया है, विद्या को ग्रहण करना नहीं। जब परीक्षाएँ निकट आती हैं तो वे ट्यूशन का साहरा लेकर परीक्षाओं में सफल हो जाते हैं। अगर इसी उद्देश्य से शिक्षा का निर्माण हुआ होता तो स्वामी विवेकानन्द जैसे महापुरुषों का निर्माण ही न हुआ होता। एक बार उन बच्चों की ओर देखो जिनके माँ बाप के पास इतना भी धन नहीं जो उनके लिए दो वक्त का भोजन जुटा पाये फिर भी उन्हें अध्ययन का सौभाग्य मिलता है और बच्चे अपने परिश्रम से अनेक ऊँचाईयों को छूते हैं। हम सब तो सम्पन्न परिवारों से हैं और भरपूर सुविधाएँ होते हुए भी उनका सदुपयोग नहीं करते हैं। हमारे व्यवहार से यही छलकता है कि हमने सिर्फ प्राथमिक शिक्षा ही प्राप्त की है उच्च माध्यमिक शिक्षा नहीं।

अतः हमारी जो शिक्षा के प्रति सोच है उसे बदलना ही होगा। शिक्षा का निर्माण सिर्फ पद पाने के लिए नहीं हुआ है और ना ही धन कमाने के लिए, बल्कि शिक्षा का वास्तविक उद्देश्य तो मनुष्य का निर्माण करना है।

मेरा एक पड़ोसी था। जिसका शिक्षा से कोई सम्बन्ध ही न था, सिर्फ माँ-बाप के दबाव में शिक्षा की औपचारिकता पूरी की जा रही थी। उसने जब तृतीय श्रेणी से माध्यमिक शिक्षा उत्तीर्ण की तब उसने ग्यारहवीं में कॉमर्स में दाखिला लिया। मैंने उससे पूछा कि तुमने क्या सोचकर कॉमर्स में दाखिला लिया है? तब उसका उत्तर लज्जा को भी लज्जित करने वाला था, उसकी सोच ने शिक्षा के महत्व को भी समाप्त कर दिया था। उसने उत्तर दिया, “यार साइंस बहुत टफ पड़ती है और आर्ट्स में तो लड़कियाँ प्रवेश लेती हैं। अब बचा क्या, कॉमर्स। इसलिए मैंने कॉमर्स में ही प्रवेश ले लिया यार।” क्या शिक्षा सिर्फ एक औपचारिकता है उसका अपना कोई अस्तित्व नहीं?

मेरे जो शिक्षा के प्रति विचार हैं उनके द्वारा मैं विद्यार्थियों को संदेश देना चाहता हूँ कि हमें समय और अपने सौभाग्य से जो शिक्षा का सुअवसर प्राप्त हुआ है उसे गवाना नहीं चाहिए। हमें जागृत होना है, शिक्षा प्राप्त करने के लिए मिले सौभाग्य का सदुपयोग करना है। शिक्षा के महत्व को समझना है, और हमें पढ़-लिखकर दुनिया की ऊँचाईयों को छुना है। अब तो हमें जागृत होना ही होगा—

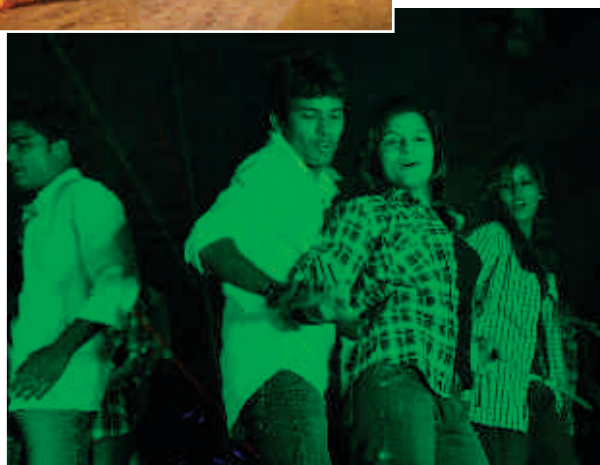
